

Buyong Sponsorship Program News 2005

1982 - The Buyong Sponsorship Program, started by Martha Zaiser, sponsored selected students through high school.

1983 to 2003 - The program expanded under the management of Paul Zaiser and activities included: sponsorships for high school and college; the daily feeding program at the elementary school; special projects at the school such as installation of electricity and water, fences and books; computer instruction for the teachers and grade six students; medical assistance for TB patients in Buyong village; organizing youth groups in the village; donations of medicines to the village health center; projects with the Barangay council such as village and coastal cleanups. Our activities included many visits to the Buyong Elementary School, preparing the daily feeding, attending graduation festivities and hosting a party for the teachers. We arranged a donation of medicines for the health center. We went island hopping and had a barbecue by the beach with young friends. Piling into a multicab, we visited the Magellan Monument on Mactan Island, then into Cebu City for sightseeing. Evenings were spent visiting with many formerly sponsored students and their families. It was a wonderful, busy, exhausting time.



Projects we will continue throughout 2005 and into spring 2006:

School Food Program

The home arts teacher and selected grade six students prepare the food every morning, serving it in the classrooms. Our funds renovated the outdoor cooking area last year, and food preparation and cooking is much more convenient. We are proud to learn that this free, nutritious, daily feeding of every child in school, is the only program of its kind in all 7,107 islands of the Philippines. Many thanks to the students at the American School in Japan and to other friends who have supported this feeding since 1986.
